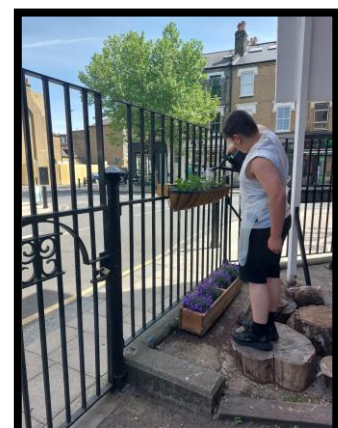
Students of the Week

On Tuesday 24th May 2022, Soru from <https://schoolofsexed.org/> visited CAL to deliver a series of workshops to all students in line with the new government **statutory** requirements for Relationships Education in secondary schools

Sensitive and important topics ranging from puberty (KS3) to consent (KS4) to abusive relationships (KS5) were discussed maturely and sensibly by our students. We think it is vital that students are given the relevant information to protect and guide themselves and others, as they grow older.

Prior to the workshops, Ms Lee-Douglas and Mr Winship hosted a Teams meeting to inform and consult with parents. We intend to invite Soru in again this Autumn and beforehand we will again talk with students via Ms Shaker's School Council and again, with parents about the content.

Thank you to all the parents for attending the meeting and supporting the school in implementing the statutory government requirements. Students completed a survey about the day and they were overwhelmingly positive about the content and having an outside lecturer visiting in the future. One student commented '**everything was covered really well**'. That is the hope we have for PSHE/RSHE at CAL.

East Soar Residential Trip – May 2022

Let our host, Schalke, have the opening thought. Sitting around the campfire, he told us that in eleven years of hosting young people at his farm, he had never met such a well-behaved and likeable group as our C.A.L students.

There we were, 10 students, 3 teachers, and 6 tents in some of the most pleasing and often breath-taking countryside in the UK. Mornings, often thick with mist, started early, with reluctant showers and breakfast. Then off to feed the goats, chickens and ponies. Herding sheep is more difficult than we'd thought!



The walks were particularly memorable. High, cliff top treks, sheer drops to a deceptively calm sea, mud tracks, up rocks, down slopes, through horned Highland cattle, over rickety bridges. Never a word of complaint. Vertigo set in when we stopped on some God-forsaken rocky outcrop. Why our students like to perch, eagle-like on the edges, we have yet to find out.

Schalke made sure we were busy; we picked up plastic from Soar Mill cove; we used blue plastic hoses to 'bracken bash', a stress-busting way of reclaiming grassland. Is the haunted barn, really haunted? The way that Winslow the naughty pug behaved suggested that it w,w,was!



On the quayside at Salcombe, we went 'crabbing'. Lines dangling in the water soon quivered as some careless crustacean was hauled in. Some tiny, some monstrous. The ferry ride down the Salcombe Ria (funnel-shaped estuary) was not for the faint-hearted. The swell on the water was exceptional.

Our students really enjoyed sea-kayaking. It was quite a sight to behold. After a few collisions and tangled oars, they got into their stride and disappeared around the headland. At the thought of wearing wetsuits, the staff, wisely declined an invitation by their guide to join in.

Dinners were served back at the farm and very good they were too. Cooked by Marijke with ingredients from the farm: sausages, chicken, burgers and fresh veg kept us going. Afterwards, the students were able to complete their John Muir Award books by writing or drawing something memorable from their day. Bedtime was at 9. Amazingly by 10.30 the field was as silent as the approaching fog.

It really was the most wonderful and restorative time. We agree with Schalke! Your kids are amazing!
